CHARTING

- 7. Who Charts the Interaction
 - ✓ Accountability
 - ✓ If Remote Site Charting How Does Near Site:
 - ➤ Get Information?
 - > Record Information?
 - > Protect and Preserve Information?
 - ✓ Confirm Via Log
 - ➤ Date/Time Received
 - > Information Received
 - ✓ Examples: Confirm Read and Understood Significant Unexpected Finding
 - > Probable Small Bowel Obstruction
 - > Possible/Probable Cancerous Growth

RECEIVING SERVICES

- 1. Doctor to Doctor Easy
 - ✓ Both Likely to Record Consult Video and Audio?
 - ✓ No Sharing of Charting With Collaborative Doctor
 - ✓ Solutions?

- > Joint Authorship
 - ❖ Send It and Scan It.
 - ❖ Add or Subtract Content by Addendum
- 2. Doctor to Remote Patient

✓ Patient Consent to Recording Doctor-Patient Interaction

LICENSING ISSUES

- 1. Diagnosing Patient From Afar Without License
- 2. Must Be Licensed in the State Patient Resides and Care Provided?
 - ✓ Not Always State Compact Agreements Reciprocity Among Participating Compact States
 - ✓ Border State Doctor Exemption
 - ✓ Abbreviated Licensure to Practice Medicine in State Where Patient Located
 - ✓ Colorado Permits Consults With Out of State Doctors Without Colorado License
 - ✓ Does Foreign Doctor Submit to Colorado Jurisdiction?
- 3. EXAMPLE: Treating Patient by Phone While Riding in a Car in Kansas City Metro or Quad Cities
- 4. International Issues
 - ✓ Licensed in That Country
 - ✓ E.U. Compact Agreement Among Doctors
 - ✓ Not Yet Available in U.S.
 - ✓ London Teleradiologist
 - ➤ Example Hughes Case

 - ✓ How is Patient's Sensitive Information Handled?
 - ✓ Do You Have a Policy/Procedure Included in HIPAA/COPPA Policies which Provides for Reasonable Efforts to Protect Sensitive Information
 - ✓ Get Review of Counsel

TELEMEDICINE STANDARD OF CARE

- 1. Defined By State Law
- 2. Hawaii, Colorado, Texas Have Telemedicine Statutes on Standard of Care
 - ✓ Typical Definition
 - ✓ Statues of Limitations for Telemed Differ From In Person?
- 3. Liability Concerns
 - ✓ Incorrect Diagnoses
 - ✓ No "On Hands" Physical Exam When Needed?
 - > Some States Physical exam is Precondition to Subsequent Use of Telemed
 - > Who Decides Physical Exam Necessary
 - > Charting Patient Advised to Seek Physical Exam
 - ✓ Image Distortion of Rash
 - ✓ Only Using Eyes, Ears and Speech Not Touch and Smell
 - ✓ Many Diagnoses Require Physical Exam

- ➤ Does State Statute Enumerate Limited Scope of Permissible Diagnoses Which Can Be Made Via Telemedicine
- ✓ Prescribing Controlled Substances
 - ➤ Allowed

- ✓ Obtaining Valid Informed Consent
 - > E Signature
- ✓ Recording Telemedicine Consult
 - > State Law on Recording
 - > HIPPA Privacy Issues
- ✓ Consent to Treating Minors
 - ➤ Mom's Verbal Consent Sufficient to Care for Minor?
- ✓ Prescribing Medication

- ✓ End of Life Decisions
- ✓ Permissible Scope of Practice
 - > Policies on Permissible Technology for Given Condition
 - ❖ Standard Telephone Call US Video Required
 - ❖ Video and Onsite M.D.

WHEN IS A DOCTOR-PATIENT RELATIONSHIP CREATED OR TERMINATED

- 1. Defined By State Law Varies Widely
 - ✓ Missouri "Last Contact" Rule Defines End of Care
 - ✓ Includes Phone Calls or Telemedicine
 - ✓ Last Contact Effects Triggering of Statute of Limitations

- 2. Need Evidence Based Guidelines That Can Be Uniformly Applied to Telemedicine
 - ✓ AMA Working on Guidelines

DATA OWNERSHIP

- 1. Fitbits Patient Send Fitbit Data to Patient Portal

 - ✓ Review, Protect, Store Data In Patient's Portal
